Arrest and Booking

- Upon arrest, Allied has contract to provide transport to JAC (SPPD provides transport directly)
- 1,343 arrests between Oct 2021-March 2022

Juv. Assessment Center (JAC)

- Upon arrival initial physical, mental health, suicide screening to see if meet criteria for release/diversion/detention
- If diversion eligible, parents notified, youth receive addtl. assessments
- Op PAR will provide voluntary SUD screening in day room after initial screen

Detention Hearing

- Occurs within 24 hours of initial detainment; judge receives MAYSI; screening results provided to PD/SAO

Reentry/Discharge Planning

Release from Secure Detention

- No formal discharge process
- Youth may be provided with 30-day prescription from psychiatrist and remaining meds from detention stay

Release from DJJ Residential Commitment Programs

- Transition staffing scheduled when youth is ready to transition home, staffing scheduled for 60 days prior to release date, CRT convened with JPO and community providers, JPO develops Plan for Success

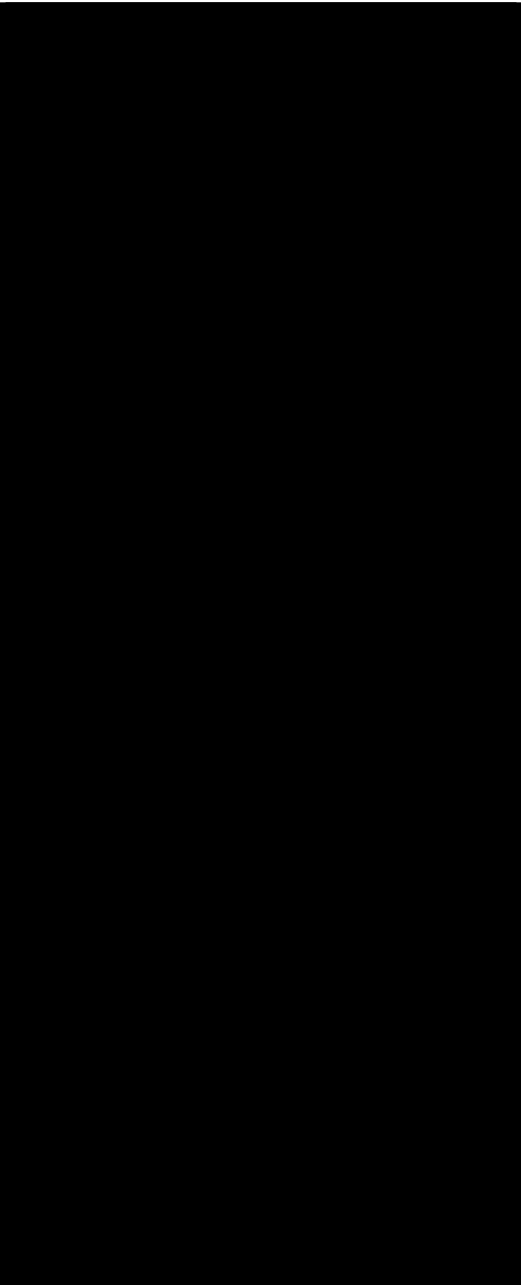
